### GENERAL OUTREACH INITIATIVES

From August 1, 2018 to July 31, 2019 KTSF completed the requirements for outreach options 1, 3, 8 and 16.

1. Participation in at least four job fairs by station personnel who have substantial responsibility in making hiring decisions;

From August 1, 2018 to July 31, 2019, KTSF participated in the following three job fairs. A KTSF representative attended each job fair, one being a member of senior management staff.

a. University of San Francisco Job Fair, San Francisco, CA; March 19, 2019

The Director of Human Resources recruited for General Sales Manager, News Production Assistant, Graphics Production Assistant, Political Sales Coordinator, Sales Account Executives and Interns.

 b. City College of San Francisco Fall Job Fair, San Francisco, CA; April, 18, 2019

The Account and Finance manager recruited for General Sales Manager, Chief Engineer, Digital Journalist, News Production Assistant and Interns.

c. Skyline College Spring Career Fair, San Bruno, CA; April 23, 2019

The Director of Human Resources recruited for Chief Engineer, News Production Assistant, Sales Account Executives and Interns.

- 3. Co-Sponsoring at least one job fair with organizations in the business and professional community whose membership includes substantial participation of women and minorities.
  - a. Bay Area 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Diversity Employment Day Career Fair, San Francisco, CA; April 9, 2019

Provides a pool of diverse, multi-cultural, and qualified professionals. The career fair targets minorities, women, seniors and people with disabilities. KTSF also promoted the job fair on air, KTSF website and career fair brochures.

The Director of Human Resources staffed a booth to meet candidates and recruited for General Sales Manager, Chief Engineer, Digital Journalist, News Production Assistant and Interns.

- 8. Establishment of Training Program designed to enable station personnel to acquire skills that could qualify them for higher level positions
  - a) NEWS: KTSF continues to offer in-house presentations which are easily accessible by News staff who have various work shifts. The most recent presentations in were provided on two separate days, July 19 & July 24, 2019 to accommodate staff and provided the latest information on the Bay Area population specifically how our Chinese news audience has evolved over time especially the growth in the Mandarin-speaking audience. This detailed overview of demographic information helps the news crew better target our evolving audience through appropriate news content and open the conversation on ways to improve our outreach to the Chinese community through our news operation. This information also enables lower and mid-level staff to acquire skills which helps to facilitate promotions within the News department.
  - b) ENGINEERING: Our newly hired Chief Engineer began weekly meetings, starting July 15, 2019 to upgrade skills among the engineering staff for Trouble Reporting Procedures. Objectives include: standardizing terminology, good engineering practices, SOPs and documentation among engineering personnel, understanding our present technical system set-up and determine improvements/upgrades for system optimization and expansion of broadcast capability.
- 16. Participation in other activities designed by the station employment unit reasonably calculated to further the goal of disseminating information as to employment opportunities in broadcasting to job candidates who might otherwise be unaware of such opportunities.

KTSF is the leading source of diverse multi-language, primarily Asian, programming in the San Francisco market, and produces much of the programming in its own local production studio, including daily news in Cantonese and Mandarin. For the past 10 years KTSF has been offering informational tours of broadcasting facility for all students and their teachers upon request and making students more knowledgeable on what is required of them when trying to enter the broadcasting industry. On May 2, 2019, Director of Programming, Victor Marino participated in the Brisbane Chamber of Commerce's Students in Business and Government program. Three students from the Lipman Middle School shadowed our KTSF news staff. He gave the students an overview of the television industry, the different careers available in TV and a "behind the scenes" look at the daily operations of a TV station that produces much of its own diverse non-English programming. The visit concluded with a Q&A session at the end.
